Sixty five prizes were given out. New people joined the organization. Many people came to see the show; it would seem to be a good idea to extend the days of the show. Joyce will look into wine being served at the reception.

Don Rose said the cost to rejoin the BAC is \$10.00 and is now due.

JoAnn Staat and Sue Ernest will audit the books for the past year in early January.

Joyce says a check for \$1,000 is being handled by ordering supplies from Cheap Joe's after the holidays (Middle School is receiving these supplies).

Joyce Grazetti made a motion that an exception to the bylaws be made to allow Penny Prettyman to serve more than two years as treasurer. The motion was seconded and it was approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

Penny Prettyman gave the Treasurer's Report: Beginning balance - \$7568.00 plus \$22.00 income minus \$302.00 for expenses leaving \$7288.00 as ending balance. Please see report submitted by Penny.

Orturd Tyler, Program Chairmen, reminded everyone there would be no meeting in November due to the Arts By the Shore event. Members interested in the February program might want to save eggshells that will be needed for the decorated eggs.

The President made another request to members to bring in new art work to exchange for the existing artwork on the walls of the Recreation Center. There was a reminder that only Plexiglas be used and not glass on the pictures.

There is a call for a chairperson for the Arts and Crafts Festival in September of next year. This person would be the overall chairperson and assisted by all committees working to make this fundraiser happen. Joyce is asking for volunteers for the **Arts By the Shore** event of November 17-20. She needs members to help with 1) hanging pictures 2) room sitters, and 3) for Sunday, 20th she needs members to bring desserts. This event takes place at the Recreation Center.

There was a request for donations from Guild members for the "Raffle for the Cure" that is being sponsored by South Harbor Golf event.

An item will be placed in the By-Laws that you must be 18 years of age in order to be a member of the Guild Association. This has been discussed and voted on previously.

NEW BUSINESS:

Orturd spoke to the group about insurance coverage while attending meetings in the Recreation Center. At present, members are not covered for accidents of any nature while at the Center. A form will be designed by January 2012, allowing members to sign on a one-time basis and be covered by the Center. 18 people attended the meeting today.

The December meeting will be a luncheon on the 16th (as the Center is not available on the 9th).

Dick Staat thanked the Guild for their help in making the booth at the Craft Fair such a success. There will be a meeting to evaluate how it can continue to be improved. There was a call for more people to serve on committees to help this event to be even more successful next year.

Don Rose encouraged members to register for the 11th Annual Brunswick Art Show. The registration will be October 1. The show will be October 17 – 29. Members can obtain a prospectus and an application from Don.

Joyce Grazetti reported that \$1,000 for art supplies for teachers in schools was given to a middle school this year. Cheap Joe's put in \$250 this year.

An announcement was made for the Arts by the Shore Show taking place November 18 – 20 at the Recreation Center. Help is needed with registration, set up, and people to assist during the show. The Recreation Center provides the food; however, the Guild needs to provide desserts. There is a call for 10 –15 people to bring desserts...please sign up!
