GENERAL INFORMATION

Eligibility

Any artist 18 years or older may enter two 2-D works and/or two 3-D works of pottery or sculpture. Work must be original, entirely the work of a single artist, executed within the last 3 years, and not exhibited in any previous AAS Spring Show. No computer-generated or digitally altered imagery, photography, air brush, furniture, fiber art, or tole painted pieces will be accepted. AAS reserves the right to refuse any work that is not properly presented, requires special installation, or is deemed inappropriate by the AAS Media committee.

All work must be for sale. AAS will retain a commission of 25% for members and 35% for nonmembers on all sales. The artist is committed to the sale price on the entry form. Entries must remain for the duration of the show (unless sold) and be removed on Sunday, March 19, 1-3 pm.

Presentation Specifications

- All 2-D artwork must be framed, wired, and ready to hang. No saw-tooth hangers are permitted.
- Gallery wrapped canvas must be at least 1.25" deep and all edges must be painted.
- Rigid Plexiglas is required for pieces over 30" in any direction.
- Maximum framed size cannot exceed 50".
- No artwork may exceed 50 lbs.
- Work needing special installation will not be accepted.

Liability

Work is entered at the risk of the artist. Although the utmost care will be taken in handling the work, neither AAS nor its representatives will be responsible for damage or loss from any cause. Submitting a work of art shall imply an agreement on the part of the artist to the conditions set forth in this prospectus.

"All of my pieces represent the blending of sculpture and painting, blurring the lines of distinction between the two. The resulting contradictions are integral to the emotional appeal and intellectual presence of my work. Figures are both realistic and amorphous, while spaces may be specific or undefined. Although I use a variety of materials in my mixed media constructions, they are combined in a unified manner, one material melting into the next."
