Library:

A motion was made by Joyce Grazetti and seconded by Phyllis Riley to terminate the Library Donation Program: up to \$500 worth of art media per year donated to Brunswick County library system. There was some discussion as to what the Guild might do with the \$500.00; however, this was tabled until a later date.

Scholarships:

Diane Sloan, Sally Buchanan, and Bonnie Pendergast met on May 8 with the four candidates nominated for this year's scholarship. The winner will be announced on May 24 and an award certificate will be given. A letter will be written to the other candidates thanking them for their participation and congratulating them on their nominations.

Grants:

Jenna Fontaine submitted the required grassroots grant report (reviewed by Penny Prettyman) for the \$1,000 OIAG received last year from the NC Arts Council through Brunswick County Arts Council. Jenna read the new statement that must accompany all notices of grant-supported workshops:

"This project received support from the Brunswick Arts Council, a 501c3 non profit, funded by North Carolina Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts."

Jon Tait elaborated further in an e-mail, "The Brunswick Arts Council is requesting the addition so that it can remain in compliance with the Designated County Partner guidelines (set forth by the NCAC). The NCAC and BAC logos currently being used on the website should both suffice for advertisements. Although, it may not always be necessary as long as you continue to mention BAC and NCAC in the text and include our logos on your website."

Arts & Crafts Festival:

Linda Drye made an appeal to the group for help with the up-coming festival. Even though the major tasks have been covered there is much work for others to do. Linda is also hoping there will be those who are interested in committing to working the festival for future years and not just this year. There is a need for new people to step in and take charge of future events.

Gary Peterson reported that he had spoken with Pat Lyles, SBSH art teacher, regarding utilizing student volunteers to assist with this labor. She was very receptive. Since the students will be back in school by Labor Day, these plans can be firmed up in August.

Penny Prettyman questioned who would be responsible for the liability of the children; she didn't believe it was a liability OIAG could accept. The visitor from Apex, Lisa Decker, was familiar with student volunteers for Relay for Life and she said the results were successful.

Mary Carter stated that the men's group in her church often do this sort of community volunteer work, and she will ask them if they will volunteer to help with our Arts & Crafts Festival.

Workshops:

OLD BUSINESS:

Arts & Crafts Festival:

Penny Prettyman reported she had received \$4,890. for booths at the festival. She has refunded \$355.00 for either withdrawals or vendors who did not meet requirements. Mailing and printing so far has totaled to \$214.26 leaving a balance of \$4,321.

At this time there are 20 spaces remaining for interested vendors.

Linda Drye, Chairman of the Committee, requested help with setting up the site. Thursday and Friday (August 29 and 30) before the event are the days that help is needed to set up the venue. As well as the need for set-up, we will need volunteers for teardown. There were some volunteers in the meeting as well as discussion of commitments from others not in attendance.

The Guild will have a tent for members to sell their artwork. It is required that you help at the festival in some capacity. Artwork for the raffle is needed. Please contact Jan Boland or Linda Drye if you want to participate.

Jan Boland is the person to contact if you are willing to sign up to work in the tent. Jan will schedule volunteers to work 2-3 hours.

The festival is Saturday, August 31, of Labor Day Weekend. Flyers are ready to distribute; Linda requested that members take some. Also, Linda is waiting to hear from the town to see if we might use posts that are already established in the area to place banners for the event.

The committee is meeting at the Senior Center, July 17, at 3 pm. All who would like to be involved are welcome to attend this meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mary Carter received a letter from the "Friends of Brunswick Town/Fort Anderson, Inc." requesting a donation from the Art Guild for the installation of a historically accurate replica of the Naval 32-pounder cannon in the historic colonial village of Brunswick Town. Being a non-profit group, the "Friends of Brunswick Town/Ft. Anderson" hope to support this historic site as a way to open the past to present and future generations through education, interpretation, and preservation.

There was much discussion among the group as to whether or not the Guild should contribute only to art-related events. Other members felt that historical issues/events in the surrounding area was a way of reaching out and being involved with the community. It was brought to a vote with a majority of members voting to donate to the FBTFT. A motion was made by Penny Prettyman, seconded by Phyllis Riley and passed by the group to give a \$50.00 donation to FBTFT.

Joyce made an announcement of a memorial award to be given in memory of Sunny Young for the spring show at Franklin Square Gallery. Joyce Grazetti and Sue Ernest will be collecting donations.

Also, there will be a ladies luncheon at the Oak Island Senior Center on Friday, July 19, at 10 am, in memory of Sunny. All who wish to attend are asked to bring a dish.

Jo Ann Staat spoke to the group re the Brunswick Arts Council and the importance of all Guild Members joining. The more members the BAC has the more clout it has in the arts community. This group is very supportive of the arts and sponsors many deserving projects and needs of our community and our Guild specifically.

If you are a member of the OIAG, membership in the BAC is only \$10. Members can go on-line or pick up a brochure to complete the application.

Patt Carney and Joyce Grazetti will present a workshop on the art of Japanese Fish Printing on August 9. Fish prints are easy, inexpensive, and don't require any sophisticated equipment.
